Since the start of the Iranian revolution, sparked by the murder of Mahsa Amini, the entire international community has been captivated by the unbelievable bravery of the Iranian youth, especially the young Iranian girls.

During the last seven weeks, we have witnessed the tragic and painful loss of many other beautiful young souls. Over 15,000 unarmed protestors have been arrested by the Islamic Republic security forces. Nearly all have been tortured and many young girls have been ruthlessly and savagely raped. There are reports that the Islamic Republic has started to execute young protestors. The Iranian parliament voted unanimously that the arrested protestors have to be executed at the earliest opportunity due to "enmity to God and pollution on earth". This is a criminal, unlawful and inhumane act, but portrays the true face of the regime that the Western democracies so desperately try to look away from with failed appeasements.

Despite the loss of life, imprisonment, torture, rape, and execution the fight for freedom and the overthrow of the Islamic Republic continues.



The association has compiled and sent many letters to government officials and departments in the U.K, E.U, USA, and Canada and we have had some responses that have been positive and engaging.

Thanks to the Iranian diaspora and our kind British, European, and North American friends and allies, the voice of Iran has been heard by the international community and government officials. Nearly all democracies have reacted to events in Iran and all have condemned the Islamic Republic's brutal crackdown.



As an association, we must now work even harder to ensure words of solidarity, empathy, and support develop swiftly into action against the criminal Islamic Republic.

The association will shortly be in a position to start funding projects so that we may be able to support the freedom activists in Iran.

Your support, thoughts, and feedback have allowed the association to grow rapidly and we encourage you all to become even more active by considering meaningful projects that we may be able to develop to help Human Rights in Iran, as well as to place even further pressure on the Islamic Republic.
