Dear Prime minister

The world has witnessed and has been shocked by the brutal and unprecedented attack on Israel by the terrorist organisation of Hamas. The assault on Israel struck during the culmination of the biblical Sukkot holiday. This timing also coincided with the 50th anniversary of the 1973 Yom Kippur War, a historical mo-ment when Israel faced an unexpected onslaught from an Arab coalition.

The current situation in Israel is grim, with a death toll of over 1200 innocent lives. More than 2,156 people have been wounded, with over 300 in critical condition. There are over 100 soldiers and civilians, including whole families with young children, were abducted into Gaza, with unknown number of British nationals among the hostages held by Hamas in the Gaza Strip.

In a horrifying turn of events, terrorists encircled a gathering of young revelers at a nature party and unleashed automatic weapon fire from all directions, resulting in a devastating bloodbath, with 260 casualties recovered.

The post-mortem of this recent violent attack will be focused internally on the Secret Service's failure to detect the planned attack by Hamas. But it will be short sightedness to on-ly focus on Hamas.

The stark reality is that Hamas is largely incapable of planning, staging, and executing an elaborate coordinated attack on Israel from land, sea, and air without attracting the watchful eye of the IDF and the Secret Service. Israel's wider gaze, as well as the international communities, must include the Islamic Republic and the Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps (IRGC) which are the root cause of this attack



Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei has been orchestrating a sinister symphony of meetings with Tehran's proxy organizations, drumming up fervor for collective ac-tion against Israel. This turmoil stems from Iran's extensive history of arming and financ-ing Palestinian terrorist groups in Gaza, Lebanon, the West Bank, Syria, Iraq, and Yemen. Since 1992, Iran has poured billions into nurturing its unholy alliance with Hamas, driven not only by shared radical Islamic ideologies but also by a shared sinister goal: the anni-hilation of Israel. According to Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant, Iran sends \$100 million annually to Hamas, \$700 million annually to Hezbollah, and tens of millions to Islamic Jihad. Hamas also uses Iranian technology and logistical support to produce arms locally.

The Islamic Republic has once again celebrated the death of innocence, this instance, the death of innocent Israeli civilians, by chanting death to Israel and America in their parliament and by handing out sweets in the streets of Tehran. IRGC commanders are gloating, possibly because this murderous attack was funded, planned, and coordinated by the IRGC. It is very much evident that they cannot contain their joy of success. Indeed, the spokesperson for Hamas has publicly announced that the Islamic Republic funded and aided this attack and without Tehran's help, this attack would not have been possible. With regret, the Western democracies failed to stand firm against Tehran despite wide-spread international condemnation of the brutal and inhumane crackdown afforded to unarmed Iranian civilians who took to the streets of Iran in September 2022 after the murder of Mahsa Amini, demanding freedom and

an end to the Islamic Republic. The crackdown by the IRGC and its militia, which was truly a crime against humanity, resulted in an estimated 700 deaths, including that of at least 60 minors, and the imprison-ment of tens of thousands of civilians who faced systematic torture, sexual assault, rape, and execution.

We are particularly outraged by the British government's softness and appeasement to-wards Islamic Republic and appeasement towards Iran, which has emboldened it to carry out such heinous acts. It is high time that our government takes a strong stance against Islamic Republic and its proxies.



These terrorist entities are the poisonous tentacles of the Islamic Republic that have spread terror and hate in the near East and are now networking in the UK in the guise of charity organisations and educational institutes. Tragically, there were reports of people in England and other places celebrating in the streets as news of the Hamas attack emerged, adding a chilling layer to this distressing situation. Those are the same people that are being supported by those charities mentioned above.
